## GLOBAL MANDATE

DPPA is the lead provider of advice and support to the Secretary-General and the UN system in the discharge of the Organization’s responsibilities related to prevention and resolution of conflicts, encompassing early warning, preventive diplomacy, mediation, peacebuilding and sustaining peace

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**Field presence**

- ▶ DPPA supports over **30 Special Political Missions** worldwide
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**Special Envoys**

- ▶ DPPA directly supports the efforts of SRSGs and Special Envoys to resolve a wide range of disputes, including electoral crises, and facilitate peace talks
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**Regional approach**

- ▶ DPPA’s **Regional Offices** in West Africa, Central Africa and Central Asia provide a platform for preventive diplomacy
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**Coordination**

- ▶ DPPA is working with **regional and sub-regional organizations** in more than **80% of its mediation engagements**
  - ▶ 9 liaison presences across the globe help deepen partnerships at the regional level
  - ▶ **8 Standby Team experts**, deployable in 72 hours, are ready to assist with mediation processes and peace negotiations around the world
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**Mediation**

- ▶ **100 deployments** foreseen in the coming year to provide expertise in process design, constitution-making, power-sharing, gender, security arrangements, transitional issues and natural resources
  - ▶ The team complements the work of the Secretary-General’s **High-Level Advisory Board on Mediation**
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**Women, peace and security**

- ▶ 100% of the UN **mediation support teams include women**
  - ▶ DPPA deploys experts who can advise on gender-sensitive conflict analysis to create an enabling environment for women’s political participation
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**Electoral support**

- ▶ DPPA provides electoral support to over **60 countries every year**, combining technical assistance with political and good offices efforts

- ▶ DPPA supports RCs and UNCTs to ensure a coherent and coordinated approach to conflict prevention
  - ▶ DPPA provides tailored support to RCs through the deployment of Peace and Development Advisers under the Joint UNDP-DPPA Programme
  - ▶ DPPA has deepened ties with the World Bank and CSOs
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**Organizational effectiveness**

- ▶ 100% of MYA projects use a gender marker and risk management approach
  - ▶ New assessment frameworks tested to better evaluate preventive diplomacy
  - ▶ Ensuring systematic dissemination of knowledge management products
  - ▶ Continued commitment to support the SG’s initiatives to prevent and respond to sexual exploitation and abuse across the UN system

# MYA ADDED VALUE

The MYA is a flexible, efficient and nimble funding instrument thanks to its **Rapid Response Window** (readily available crisis-response funding and surge capacity to support preventive diplomacy efforts) and its **New Ideas Window** (to support innovation and pilot new approaches on the use of new technologies, youth empowerment, climate security and women, peace and security). MYA supports activities worldwide.
